# Pune Rural SP: One Village, One Police Patil, One Constable to launch on May 1

Police constables will visit the assigned village every seven to eight days, says SP Deshmukh

PUNE RURAL police is set to launch One Village, One Police Patil, One Constable, a technology-enabled initiative to ensure greater synergy between the police machinery and police patils appointed for each village in the district. The initiative will be launched from May 1, said Superintendent of Police (Pune Rural) Pankaj Deshmukh during an interaction with *The Indian Express* on Thursday.

Deshmukh, an Indian Police Service officer of 2011 who had been the SP of Pune Rural Police from February 2024, said, "Police patil is a very important functionary in the police set up. Till date, we have more than 1,300 police patils in our jurisdiction. With regard to their establishment, they fall under the revenue department, but on the operation front, they regularly deal with the

police. More than 200 positions are vacant and we are following up for their recruitment. The police patils play a key role in sharing crucial inputs and intelligence from their respective villages and also play a role in cross-checking the inputs we have received. Our police station staff, beat in-charge, also rely on police patils for cer-

tain functions."

"At the police station there is a monthly meeting of police patils. We also get their help for certain policing duties including bandobast. In rural areas, a police patil is an important functionary and maintains a good connect with the local population. They are recruited through

a regular process examination and training and get a monthly stipend once they are appointed. There is a manual for police patils and a law that governs them," he added.

Deshmukh added that One Village, One Police Patil, One Constable will launch from May 1.

"Under this we will ensure that one of our constables will visit the assigned village every seven to eight days. This will give

the constable first hand information of issues and developments in the village. This will help police get more proactive and better intelligence beforehand. At a village level, there are some things which always simmer, We have around 1,800 villages in our jurisdiction. If we count the group gram panchayats, then the number comes down to 1,650. We have a strength of 3,400 and sufficient constables at the police station level. On the technology aspect of the initiative, five important locations have been marked and geotagged in each village. The assigned constable will visit these spots to mark his presence along with the police patil by taking a selfie. On other days, the police patil will do so individually. This will ensure both of their presence and daily synergy. Our interaction with police patrols will improve and so will our vigilance through them."

## Rahul Gandhi's lawyer given video of alleged defamatory remarks against V D Savarkar

CONGRESS LEADER Rahul Gandhi on Friday, through his lawyer before a court in Pune, received a pendrive carrying a video of his speech in which he allegedly made defamatory remarks against Hindutva ideologue V D Savarkar.

A defamation complaint was filed by Savarkar's grandnephew Satyaki Savarkar in a Pune court against Gandhi for his alleged defamatory remarks against Savarkar during his speech in London on March 5, 2023.

According to Satyaki, Gandhi had said that Savarkar had written a book in which he stated that he (Savarkar) and five to six of his friends beat up a Muslim and were 'delighted' about it. Satyaki said V D Savarkar had not written any such book as claimed by Gandhi, nor has such an incident ever happened.

In his petition, Satyaki had stated that Gandhi had intentionally made false, malicious and wild allegations against Savarkar. With his complaint, Satyaki had submitted a few news reports as well as a YouTube link of a video of Gandhi's speech in London as evidence.

Gandhi's counsel Milind Pawar had filed an application in the court on April 7, seeking this video, along with a copy of book "Mazi Janmathep" authored by V D Savarkar and other documents.

The court allowed Pawar's application for a summons trial. Pawar today submitted that "book Hindutva" and is very important for evidence in this summons trial."

When contacted, advocate Kolhatka said that the "Hindutva" book is not related to the case. "The defence should show in which of V D Savarkar's book, the objectionable content claimed by Rahul Gandhi is mentioned..." he said.

long the contamination had gone unnoticed. "The cleaning of the water filter tank has not taken place for months – it seems. The bottom of the filter is layered with brown-like mud and worms swimming in the water," he said.


Students shared their personal experiences with the contaminated water. Arjun Shelke, a first-year MA Economics student said, "On Wednesday after my classes I went to drink water at the filter near the library and the taste of water was bad. It tasted like I'm drinking sand," he said.

"After tasting it, I saw worms in my bottle that came through the filter. I was totally shocked. I had to visit the doctor after going back home as I had severe stomach pain after."

Another student, Vaishnavi

Pawar, expressing disappointment over basic hygiene, said, "We are paying full fees – Rs 14,000 in my case – and in return we're getting this? The filter hasn't been cleaned in months. Who is responsible for this? The college needs to answer where our fees are going if they can't even maintain clean drinking water."

Responding to the issue, Anand Katikar, security of the Deccan Education Society, assured that action is being taken. "We are working on it. We have also instructed the maintenance team to clean up all the filters in the college. This time we missed cleaning the filter. The college will pay attention to it. We apologise and will maintain the basic needs in the college," Katikar told *The Indian Express*.

### PORSCHE CRASH CASE

## Court sets bail conditions for accused minor driver's mother

SETTING THE conditions for her bail, a special court on Friday in Pune directed the mother of the minor boy accused in the Porsche car crash case to not disclose her identity anywhere for the next three months, report to the investigation officer every week and not leave India without prior permission. These were three of the bail conditions given by the court, which comes after she was granted bail by the Supreme Court (SC) earlier this week.

An SC bench of Justices B R Gavai and A G Masih had granted bail to the minor's mother on Tuesday.

Arguments were held before a special court in Pune on her bail conditions. Special Public Prosecutor Shishir Hiray argued that she should be asked to stay

beyond the limits of Pune district. Hiray also argued that she should be given directions to not share any of her images and videos on social media or any other platform.

After hearing the arguments, the court framed the bail conditions that the accused should furnish a PR Bond of Rs 1 lakh with one or two sureties in the like amount.

## Two sacked members of Juvenile Justice Board move HC; notice issued to govt

THE BOMBAY High Court has issued a notice to the Maharashtra government on the pleas filed by two sacked Juvenile Justice Board members, challenging the termination of their services in connection with bail granted to a juvenile accused allegedly involved in the Pune Porsche car crash case.

In October last year, the government had terminated the services of two JJB members - L N Danavade and Kavita Thorat.

citing procedural lapses and misuse of powers under the Juvenile Justice Act.

The action followed a probe by the Women and Child Development (WCD) Department, which found them guilty of misconduct and non-compliance with norms while granting bail to the juvenile.

After the termination of their services, Danavade and Thorat approached the high court through advocate Harshvardhan Pawar, contending that their removal from the JJB was "illegal".

On April 23, a bench of Justices A S Chandurkar and M

M Sathaye issued a notice to the state WCD department and posted the matter for further hearing on June 18.

Thorat in her plea had claimed the government had in June last year issued a show-cause notice to her to which she had submitted a reply. An inquiry was held, after which she was terminated.

However, a copy of the inquiry report was not supplied to the petitioner's plea claimed.

Hence, the action of terminating the appointment of the petitioner as a Member of the Juvenile Justice Board (JJB), Pune is illegal, it claimed.
